STATE MATHCOUNTS WINNTERS-SHANNON SCHULTZ, PE, CFM

A team of middle school Mathletes® from Patrick Henry Middle School of Sioux Falls won the state MATHCOUNTS competition. The top individual was Eric Feng, an eighth grader also from Patrick Henry.

Members of the winning team are: Eric Feng, Akshay Choudhry, Ajun Choudhry, and Max Peters from Patrick Henry Middle School. Their coach is Dr. Sharon Andrews, EdD from the ULE/Humanities programs.

The second and third place teams are from Mickelson Middle School from Brookings, and Edison Middle School of Sioux Falls, respectively. Fourth place was won by Roncalli Junior High School of Aberdeen.

The top four individuals from the State Competition will represent South Dakota at the 2013 Raytheon MATHCOUNTS National Competition in Washington, DC, May 9-12. The four team members are Eric Feng, Patrick Henry Middle School, Sioux Falls; Jenny Jin, Mickelson Middle School, Brookings; Judah Aderhold, Temple Builders Academy, Bath; and Askhary Choudhry, Patrick Henry Middle School, Sioux Falls. The national team coach is Dr. Sharon Andrews, EdD, Patrick Henry Middle School, Sioux Falls.

In our increasingly technological society, those students who do not begin developing strong problem-solving, logical thinking and analytical abilities in middle school will face an uphill battle later in life if they wish to pursue a medical, scientific, mathematical, engineering or technical career. As a national math enrichment, coaching and competition program designed to improve math skills among U.S. students, MATHCOUNTS prepares students for future career opportunities and success. More than 6 million students across the U.S. have participated in the MATHCOUNTS program.
