
MATHCOUNTS VOLUNTEERS NEEDED—PHIL Gundvaldson, pe

CELEBRATING E-WEEK IN FEBRUARY-ERIN STEEVER, PE



Free First Fridays – In collaboration with the Kirby Science and Discovery Center (KSDC) at the Washington Pavilion, in Sioux Falls, SD, SDES volunteers will celebrate Leonardo da Vinci with over 300 patrons through their "Engineering with Leo" experience. While most of his inventions never made it off the page he drew them on, we know that he was looking into the future at machines that would make work easier and life better for each of us! An engineer with SDES will walk the audience through their current day experiences in the field as an engineer, while other SDES volunteers will assist KSDC staff with multiple activity stations. Simple machines that make up a bucket-wheel excavator, skateboard, water lift and spring scale (wheel/axel), thread cutter (wedge), tape dispenser and da Vinci's

catapult (levers/pulleys) to name a few will be discovered and incorporated into a Guessing Game. This event will take place on February 6, 2015 from 5:00 to 8:00 pm.

STEM Girls – Encouraging middle school girls to pursue STEM careers, our theme this year plays on Disney's latest animation, *Big Hero 6*. We'll be at three underserved middle schools in Sioux Falls, SD to build, test and re-design paper plate "Speed Racers" tying in with the with supersonic fast mag-lev bike that the female industrial technology and mechanical engineering student GoGo Tomago's character develops in the movie. We'll then move on to our main build with Baymax as the inspiration. Baymax is a home health aide robot and SDES volunteers will assist the girls in building a "junk drawer robot" using Popsicle sticks, syringes and pencil erasers to make a Hydraulic Gripper Robot. STEM Girls is part of an after-school program run through the Kirby Science and Discovery Center. SDES develops an engineering themed plan each February, walk the girls through our development as female engineers, and provide a pathway for the students to ask questions and see themselves in engineering career paths. Our Hydraulic Gripper Robot is being provided by the South Dakota State University Extension and 4-H STEM program. Inspiration for the "Speed Racer" is from <u>www.howtoons.com</u>. has been involved in many school activities and receiving a number of awards including: National Honor Society, Varsity Cross Country (Hero Award, Coaches Award, and MVP), Basketball, Track (MVP), and Swimming (Male Swimmer of the Year). From his involvement in athletics and the National Honors Society, to his ability to work through adversity, his peers and advisors have recognized Nicholas as a natural leader and role model who leads by example.

Throughout high school, Nicholas has received the most satisfaction from his community service and mission work which included volunteering his time to help with a church remodel and assisting those in need with "fixing up" their home.

Nicholas gained interest in Engineering when he began working for a local construction crew a few years ago and started looking into career options along those lines. "When I read about Civil Engineering, I knew it was a perfect fit." He would like to work on difficult projects and oversee them to ensure they are built to plan with excellent functionality and safety. As a Civil Engineer Nicholas knows he can make a difference while enjoying the work he does. Nicholas plans to attend South Dakota State University and Major in Civil Engineering.

Alex Spies, attending Watertown High School, stood out academically while also being involved in numerous school and community activities. These activities include: Boy Scouts (Senior Patrol Leader, Life Scout – on track to be an Eagle Scout), Teens for Christ (President), Math Counts, Peer Helpers, BEST –Boosting Engineering Science Technology- Robotics (Marketing Group Lead, Notebook and Design Documenter, Chief Designer, and Team Leader), and National Honor Society.

As long as he can remember, Alex has always been interested in becoming an Engineer and, as a young child, he would tell people that he wanted to go to the "School of Minds". Through Lego League during his elementary and middle school days, to his present participation with the BEST Robotics Team, he learned that not only did he enjoy solving problems and finding new ways to accomplish tasks, he was good at it. "It's not just about creating something; it's also about marketing and talking to people." Alex plans to attend South Dakota School of Mines & Technology and major in Mechanical Engineering.

Jamison French has excelled academically as a senior at Brookings High School. He spent countless hours collecting, sorting, packing, and transferring clothes through this project. He also started a fundraiser in which the money was used to purchase duffle bags to ship the clothes to Vietnam through the Catalyst Foundation. "The satisfaction comes from knowing that I'm helping my cultural community with some essential needs."

Jamison has always been interested in how machines are assembled and work as well as being intrigued by innovation concepts of energy efficiency and compactness. He recently attended a Youth Engineering Adventure Camp on the campus of South Dakota State University where he was able to further his interests in Mechanical Engineering. Jamison plans to attend South Dakota State University and Major in Mechanical Engineering.

In 2014, the Eastern Chapter sponsored two \$1000 Engineering Scholarships at South Dakota State University. To qualify, students must be entering their junior or senior year and major under the College of Engineering. The two recipients selected by SDSU faculty were **James Hisek**, majoring in General Engineering (leaning towards Civil), and **John Miller**, majoring in Operations Management and German.
