# EASTERN CHAPTER AWARDS AND SCHOLARSHIPS-LANCE WEATHERLY, PE

The Eastern Chapter of the South Dakota Engineering Society (SDES) held its annual awards banquet on Saturday, February 28, 2015 at the Downtown Holiday Inn – City Centre in Sioux Falls, SD. The Honorable Mayor Mike Huether provided the keynote speech to a group of 90 attendees representing a wide array of engineering disciplines. Chad Hanisch, P.E. with Infrastructure Design Group based in Sioux Falls, SD was awarded the Eastern Chapter Engineer of the Year. Michelle Carter, P.E. with HDR Engineering in Sioux Falls, SD was awarded the Eastern Chapter Young Engineer of the Year. The first Eastern Chapter project of the year award recipient was the Denny Sanford PREMIER Center represented by the City of Sioux Falls. The second Eastern Chapter Project of the Year award recipient was the Bel Brands Wastewater Pre-Treatment Facility designed by Banner Associates based in Brookings, SD. Chapter award winners will compete at the state level during the South Dakota Engineering Society's Annual Conference to be held April 9th and 10th in Pierre.

The SDES Eastern Chapter is funding \$8,800 in Engineering scholarships in 2015, whose scholarship recipients were recognized at the Eastern Chapter banquet. Nicholas Zolnowsky from Parkston, SD, the recipient of a \$2000 Engineering scholarship, plans to attend South Dakota State University and major in Civil Engineering. Alex Spies from Watertown, SD, the receipt of a \$2000 Engineering scholarship, plans to attend South Dakota School of Mines & Technology and major in Mechanical Engineering. Jamison French from Brookings, SD, the recipient of a \$2000 Engineering scholarship, plans to attend South Dakota State University and major in Mechanical Engineering. James Hisek from Yankton,SD, the recipient of a \$1000 Engineering scholarship, currently attends South Dakota State University majoring in General Engineering. John Miller from Minnetonka, MN, the recipient of a \$1000 Engineering scholarship, currently attends South Dakota State University majoring in Operations Management and German. Emily Lawrenson from Beresford, SD, the recipient of a \$800 Engineering scholarship, plans to attend South Dakota State University and major in Civil Engineering.

## DESIGN CHALLENGE-ERIN STEEVER, PE

Design Challenge is an annual Pavilion program that aims to motivate and inspire innovation in students in grade K-12 through a hands-on engineering challenge. We've just announced this year's Design Challenge, which will take place on Saturday, March 28. We are looking for volunteers to help with the various activities of this very exciting day!

There are a variety of opportunities to help:

- Part I Judge: Working in teams of two, Part I judges evaluate the "At Home" part of the challenge, where teams must build a working device that theoretically could make potable drinking water, and demonstrate their device on-site during Design Challenge. Devices will be judged using specific criteria, which Part I Judges will receive prior to March 28. No prior knowledge is required, but familiarity with camping/nature/basic science concepts would be helpful.
- Part II Judge: Working in teams of two, Part II judges evaluate the "On-Site" part of the challenge, where teams are given a series of wilderness survival situation cards and a crate of materials, and must complete the tasks on the situation cards within a certain timeframe. Task completion will be judged using specific criteria, which Part II Judges will receive prior to March 28. No prior knowledge is required, but familiarity with camping/nature/basic science concepts would be helpful.
- Master of Ceremonies: The Master of Ceremonies announces teams as they begin the on-site challenge, possibly doing interview with team members, offering a play-by-play commentary at times. Individuals with outgoing personalities are preferred.
- Environmental Assistants: The location of the on-site challenge will be a simulated prairie, where
  rocks, fake trees, "rivers" of water, etc. will be set up. Environmental Assistants reset the environment after each team completes the on-site challenge.
- Registration/Information Table: These individuals assist with team check-in, passing out schedules and team gift bags, answer questions about locations, etc.
- Youth Area: We plan to have a kids area with activities for younger siblings to participate in while others are competing. Parents would be required to remain in the same room as the activity area, but volunteers in the Youth Area need to be welcoming and engaging. Previous experience with young children is preferred.





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
