MORE UPCOMING EVENTS ERIN STEEVER, PE

Join us for Volunteer Opportunities at the Washington Pavilion in February and March

There are two new outreach activities available to promote engineering to the next generation. The Washington Pavilion Action Arts and Science Program (AASP) began in 1999 with a mission to bring high-quality art and science experiences to children with limited access to extracurricular activities. Today, they engage and inspire more than 450 students at 20 locations outside the Washington Pavilion per week. It's a few years old, but check out this video for a glimpse into what makes AASP so special.

AASP partners sites for 2018-19 include: Sioux Falls School District Kids Inc. (8 elementary schools), Juvenile Detention Center, Volunteers of America-Dakotas (Dakotas Youth Center), Multi-Cultural Center (Natives Count, Froggy Reads and Native Youth programs), KidStop Program, Kidz Count Program, Ignite (formerly Youth Enrichment Services at Eastside and 14th Street locations) and the Boys & Girls Club (Sneve Ave. location), Harmony South Dakota, Lutheran Social Services (Hilltop and East Side locations).

AASP is a recipient of the prestigious National Arts and Humanities Youth Program Award. The award is given by the President's Committee on the Arts and the Humanities and its partner agencies, the National Endowment for the Arts, the National Endowment for the Humanities and the Institute of Museum and Library Services.

They're moving into a "Build It Big!" Unit in February and March, and they'd love engineer volunteers to assist with their programming. There are several opportunities for consideration:

- 1. **AASP Site Visit** Engineer is paired with AASP Instructor and visit 1 2 sites **Feb. 20-22** (National Engineering Week) or the week of March 18-22, 2019. Program times are typically between 3:30 5 pm, and they are at the most sites Tuesday-Thursday. Volunteers will be able to work out a schedule with AASP.
- ★ Engineer's will briefly share about what you do (all levels acceptable), what skills or training is needed for your job, show any special tool, pictures of projects you have worked on, models/prototypes, etc. Keep this to no more than 7 10 minutes total.
- ★ Engineer's will assist with AASP instructor led activity related to civil engineering, focusing on making connections with students, with emphasis on the process over the end product.

AASP Family Night — **Friday, March 8, 2019** | **5 – 8 pm.** Family Night is an opportunity for the students in our program to bring their families to the Washington Pavilion for hands-on activities, pizza, exploring the Visual Arts Center and the Kirby Science Discovery Center, and see the DREAM BIG film in the Wells Fargo CineDome. Many of the students in our program do not have financial resources to visit the Pavilion at other times. It also encourages families to spend time together doing activities, something that may not possible because of family dynamics or work schedules. A major activity of this evening will be creating a Box City (https://cube-education.org/box-city/), but there will be other engineering and architecture activities for families to do (most likely repeating a few favorites from Free First Friday in February). We will also have a Career Corner, where (ideally) a member would be available to talk about careers/ industries, maybe show some tools or examples and we would welcome any literature about engineering, SDES and/or specific companies that you wanted to make available for families to take.


