


HABITAT FOR HUMANITY KARI JOHNSON, PE

Dear Friends at South Dakota Engineering Society - Eastern,

Thank you for your donation of \$410 designated for food. Without the help of wonderful people like you, we could not continue.

The lives of our guests often become very difficult throughout the year. Many of the daily needs that we tend to take for granted are a struggle for our guests to meet. Those needs may include finding ways to feed their family, paying for rent, heat, medical, and many other miscellaneous bills. Sometimes paychecks do not stretch far enough to meet all of these needs. They are thankful to The Banquet for helping them make it through each day. It is a place of shelter, community, and one where they can receive a nutritional meal—maybe their only meal for that day.

- We are now in our 34th year of being a volunteer feeding ministry. We currently serve 13 meals a week. Each one of these meals is prepared by, paid for, and served by volunteers. Over 1,200 volunteer groups are committed to serving at The Banquet.
- In addition to our feeding ministry, this past year hundreds of volunteers collected, organized and distributed over 6,600 school backpacks to excited kids and extremely grateful parents through The Banquet's Project SOS.
- In February 2014, The Banquet expanded its ministry to a second location. The Banquet now serves a meal every Tuesday and Wednesday evening at The Nordstrom-Johnson building located on the W. H. Lyon Fairgrounds.

This past year our volunteer groups served just under 200,000 meals, over 24,000 of these meals were served to children 12 or younger. Approximately 18,000 gallons of milk were served at The Banquet in 2018.


