SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS BY LANCE MAYER—PE

As part of the 2015-2016 scholarship program, SDES-Eastern Chapter awarded three \$2000 Engineering Scholarships out of 57 applicants to the following high school seniors:

Spencer Huber is ranked 9th in his class at Yankton High School. Spencer has been involved in many school activities receiving a number of awards including: National Honor Society, Boys State, Football, Track, and Wrestling. He has been a captain on his wrestling team since his sophomore year and currently holds six school records. In the community, he has served meals for the homeless, packed meals for people in Haiti, washed cars to raise money for Habitat for Humanity, volunteered at local track and wrestling meets, tutored Spanish, and volunteers at the Majestic Bluffs Nursing Home playing Bingo and Wii Bowling.

Spencer plans on attending South Dakota State University to study Mechanical Engineering with a minor in Sustainable Energy Systems. He has always been interested in alternative energy sources and their uses such as electric cars, solar panels, and wind turbines. He believes that electricity from renewable energy sources will be the way of the future and he wants to be a part of helping push for a more eco-friendly way of life.

Across the globe, 884 million people lack access to safe drinking water, causing 3.5 million deaths every year. The South Dakota State University Chapter of Engineers Without Borders (SDSU EWB) would like your help with providing this vital resource to the community of Carmen Pampa, Bolivia. So far SDSU EWB has traveled to Carmen Pampa to install chlorinators on the campus of the Unidad Academica Campesina (UAC), a university whose mission is to provide higher education to young people in rural areas through academic, research and extension activities. We've already seen some great results, with students on campus reporting fewer water-borne illnesses. For the summer of 2016, SDSU EWB plans to send a group of students to construct a sand filtration system in order to increase the water quality and provide a more complete water treatment system.


