SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS BY LANCE MAYER, PE

As part of the 2016-2017 scholarship program, SDES-Eastern Chapter awarded three \$2000 Engineering Scholarships out of 45 applicants to the following high school seniors:

Joshua Powell is ranked 1st in his class at Brandon Valley High School and actively participates in a number of extracurricular school activities. Those activities include: Sioux Falls CTE Robotics (Team Captain), Springdell 4-H Club (13-year member holding offices of Vice President, Historian & Camp Counselor), Cross Country (Team Captain and Academic All State), National Honor Society (3 years), 3-time Academic Letter Winner, Band (6-years including First Chair 2 years along with BEC Honor Band, Quad State Honor Band and East Central Honor Band) Peer Minister, Quiz Bowl (3 years), Science Bowl, FFA, and 250 volunteer hours with the Serve and Learn Student Association.

Joshua's most satisfying achievement was becoming a 4-H camp counselor. As a counselor he was responsible for 10 to 15 children for a week straight where he was woken up at all hours of the night, complained to and both physically and mentally worn out by a group of very active young boys. However, in the end it was all worth it for Joshua to see the development of each child both individually and as a group. They gave him confidence as a leader and, in the end, there is nothing in the world Joshua would trade for his time as a camp counselor. Joshua plans on attending the South Dakota School of Mines and Technology to study Mechanical Engineering.

Jarod Osborn, attending Watertown High School, stood out academically while also being involved in a variety of school and community activities. These activities include: National Honor Society, Football (2016 Academic All-State), Wrestling, BEST Robotics Team (Vice-President and Head Technological Architect) and the Debate Team. Jarod is also a member of the National Forensics League and has been an active member of the Boy Scouts of America where he has attained the rank of "Life Scout" as well as being a Brotherhood member of the Order of the Arrow.

The achievement that has given Jarod the most satisfaction is when he became a Brotherhood member of the Order of the Arrow (OA). The OA is the national honor society of the Boy Scouts and becoming a member requires being nominated by other Boy Scouts. Once nominated, a scout must complete an ordeal, including volunteer work and sleeping outdoors, before they are an official member of the OA. An ordeal member must repeat the ordeal again in ten months to become a Brotherhood member. It took time and effort to achieve this honor as well as being noticed by others for his dedication to Boy Scouts. Jarod enjoys performing community service in Boy Scouts and becoming a Brotherhood member allowed him to work with others that shared his same dedication along with preparing him with important life skills. Jarod plans to attend South Dakota School of Mines and Technology and major in Computer Science/Engineering.

Ellie Burczek has excelled academically as a senior at Watertown High School in the top 3% of her class. She has been a member of the Robotics Club for 4 years and is in her second year as Head of Engineering. Other activities Ellie is involved with includes: National Honor Society, ABC Book Club, Key Club, and Cross Country. She has volunteered in Teen Court and Keystone over the last year and is a youth development professional at the Boys and Girls Club.

Until Ellie became involved with Robotics, she thought she would end up studying fine arts. However, she learned how vital engineering is to solve humanity's greatest problems as well as being central to everyday life. Many people long to change the world and Ellie feels that studying engineering during this period of rapid technological progression is a realistic way to achieve such a noble goal. She finds engineering incredibly self-fulfilling and reaffirming stating "I feel useful and confident having the ability to create and engineer solutions to problems". Ellie plans to attend the South Dakota School of Mines and Technology and major in Electrical Engineering.

In 2016, the Eastern Chapter sponsored two \$1000 Engineering Scholarships at South Dakota State University. To qualify, students must be entering their junior or senior year and major under the College of Engineering. The two recipients selected by SDSU faculty were Zachary Grudem, majoring in Electrical Engineering, and Emily Lawrenson (a former 2015 Eastern Chapter Scholarship winner), majoring in Civil Engineering.

Also in 2016, the Eastern Chapter sponsored a \$400 Engineering Scholarship which was made available through a permanent endowed fund held within the South Dakota Community Foundation. Grant Gonsor was the recipient selected by the Scholarship Committee and he presently attends South Dakota School of Mines and Technology majoring in Electrical Engineering.






